

Check to see if you can carry your medicine

Essential medicines?

Only carry what is necessary for the trip.

Try to carry your medicine in your hold baggage.

Essential medicines should fit in your clear, litre sized re-sealable bag and must be in containers of less than 100ml.

There is no limit for powders or pills.

If the medicine is in a container of over 100ml (or your medicines and other liquids together are over 100ml) you will need the **prior approval of your airline.**

You must bring proof of prescription such as a letter from a medical doctor or health care professional.

You will be asked to verify these medicines at security. This may involve tasting, or testing on the skin.



Essential medical equipment?

Other essential medical equipment can only be carried with the **prior approval of your airline.** If it fits within your one piece of hand baggage then approval is not required.

This will be checked at security. You will be asked to verify your need for the item. **The item should be marked as essential medical equipment.**



Children's medicines?

Children's medicines must also be verified - security officers will check these.

Only carry what is necessary for the trip.

Non-prescription medicines for children and adults are available at our airside pharmacy after security.



Baby milk or juice? Carry what you need for your flight only. You will be asked to taste milk or juice at security.
